Aim

The aim of the Eastern Winter Study is to provide an opportunity for all brothers and sisters to enjoy Bible study and fellowship in a family friendly setting. We aim to offer a comfortable, warm and relaxed environment in which to worship God, study His word, and to spend time with other brothers and sisters.

Venue

Letton Hall is a late 18th century house set in 10 acres of its own grounds, with wonderful views over the Norfolk countryside. The local village of Shipdham is on the A1075 between Thetford and Dereham. Post code IP25 7SA.

Registration and parking

Registration is open from 2pm on Saturday 27th December. When entering the driveway for Letton Hall, please follow signs for 'Letton Hall' and park outside the main doors of the house. Alternative parking can be found located between Letton Hall and The Stables (shown as Dolphin Court on the map).

Letton Hall facilities

- ★ Letton Hall accommodation comprises a mixture of single rooms, double rooms, family rooms and dormitories. No bedrooms are en-suite. Easily accessible bathrooms, toilets and showers are provided on all floors and some rooms that are close to bathrooms will be made available to those who need them. Although most bedrooms are on first or second floors, there are a few ground floor rooms available in a separate wing suitable for those with mobility difficulties or disabilities. There are stair-lifts to access this wing and the upper rooms. If you feel you need the use of one of these rooms or can't manage two flights of stairs, please inform Bro. Nathan & Sis. Ruth Walker.
- ★ All bed linen is provided (duvet and duvet cover, sheet, pillow and pillowcase), but please bring your own towels.
- ★ Cots and highchairs can be made available - please inform Bro. Nathan & Sis. Ruth Walker if needed. You will need to bring cot linen.
- ★ Bedrooms will be allocated on arrival.
- ★ Fire regulations are posted in each room. Please read on arrival and ensure you are familiar with the procedure.

Guidance notes for Eastern Winter Study

- ★ Sisters are asked to wear head coverings at all main sessions.
- ★ No books or CDs etc. are to be brought for sale at the study.
- ★ We ask that all attendees are considerate in their use of mobile phones and electronic devices. In particular we ask that they are either turned off, or are in flight/aircraft mode and set to *Do not disturb* mode, during sessions.
- ★ Please wear your badge at all times - this helps us get to know each other, and helps the on-site staff know who is part of our group.
- ★ Please be punctual for all sessions, as this ensures we keep to time.
- ★ The main doors will be locked at 2300, and we ask that everybody is in their own rooms and quiet between 2300 and 0700. Access through the garden door to/from the Norfolk Wing will be available all night. All main session talks will be recorded, and will be available on the Eastern Winter Study website for downloading after the event. - ★ A collection will be taken for the Christadelphian Bible Mission.
- ★ A wireless internet connection is available in the conference room and library if required.
- ★ A full attendee list and rotas will be available for perusal upon arrival.
- ★ During the afternoon we shall be offering a selection of activities including board games, jigsaws, or crafts. If you have any board games, jigsaws or crafts which might be suitable, please bring them with you.
- ★ It is strongly recommended that warm clothing is brought, for night-time wear as well as day-time.
- ★ Those intending to join the walk will need to wear boots or sturdy shoes.
- ★ The walk may not be suitable for buggies.
- ★ As we shall have a number of small children present, it is important that the stairs to the basement are secured by the safety gate at the top at all times.



Directions to Letton Hall (IP25 7SA)

From the South & Midlands

Follow A14 & A11 to Thetford. Continue on A11 Thetford bypass, until A1075 roundabout. Turn left at roundabout on to A1075 to Watton & Dereham. Continue on the A1075 through Watton, until you reach Shipdham. Beware the sharp bends in Shipdham. Follow instructions from Shipdham below.

From the North & A47

Take A47 towards Swaffham, and turn off the A47 into Swaffham. In Swaffham take the A1065 towards Newmarket & Thetford. Continue on the A1065 for about 7 miles, and then take the B1108 left turn to Watton & Bodney. At the traffic lights in Watton, turn left on to the A1075 to Dereham. Continue on the A1075 until you reach Shipdham. Follow instructions from Shipdham below.

From Norwich

Take A47 towards Swaffham & Dereham. Turn off the A47 at Dereham, signed A1075 Watton and Dereham. At the first roundabout, follow signs for the A1075 Watton (3rd exit). Continue up this road, under the bridge and over the railway crossing. At the traffic lights, turn left, following A1075 to Watton. Continue on the A1075 until you reach Shipdham. Follow instructions from Shipdham below.

From Shipdham

Turn directly off the A1075 opposite the Church into a narrow street (signed Cranworth). This is Mill Road and leads out of the village. At the point of leaving the village, you will see Bullock Park on your right. The road bends round to the left. Continue along this road for about a mile and Letton Hall's driveway is on your left. You do not need to turn off on to any track until you see the Letton Hall sign, which is visible from the road.

Please do not turn into the track signed for Gardeners Cottage.

If you are following a Sat Nav, please note that the postcode covers a few properties. If it can use map references, for greater precision specify
